<p>Comments: In 1 of 5 child records verified, one emergency contact information was missing. The child record files must have the name, address and telephone number of at least 2 emergency contacts. The operator must make sure that all child records are complete.</p> <p>In 3 of the 5 child records verified, the emergency contact address is incomplete. The city part or the postal code was missing. The operator must make sure that all child records are complete.</p>

<p>Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor observed detergent pods and detergent booster beads on the top of the dryer. Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies must be locked and made inaccessible to children. The operator locked the laundry products in the designated locked area. Deficiency is now compliant.</p>			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site in the morning to conduct a monitoring inspection. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that the past Quality Assurance Monitor information was posted in the posting area. The Quality Assurance Monitor left a business card for the operator to update the information.

The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the operator regarding designation requirements. The operator confirmed that the Quality Improvement plan is current and confirmed that the 10 hours of professional learning for this renewal year is in the process to be completed.

The Quality Assurance Monitor observed the children eating their morning snack (lunch boxes). The children were also observed playing in the indoor play area with costumes pretending Halloween play. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed the operators applying positive conflict resolution with the children. The children were also engaged in playing hide and seek with the operator. The children were also observed in the transition to go play in the outdoor play area.
