General Comments
<p>Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct a Monitoring Inspection. Upon arrival all classes were finishing up activities before preparing for morning snack. The 4-year-old class was split into 2 groups; one group stayed in the classroom while the other went to the bathroom to wash hands. Once both groups had returned from washing hands, children sat together as one Educator read "If you give a mouse a brownie." Once the story finished, the children made their way to the tables for snack time. Educators were attentive to the needs of the children, offering assistance opening containers and with water bottles. All classes were observed having morning snack.</p> <p>In the 3-year-old classroom the children sat at tables playing with red and pink playdoh. Each table had sufficient playdoh and accessories for all children in the room. The children used rolling pins, heart cookie cutters, gems and buttons as they made their playdoh creations. In the Infant class, Educators were observed sitting with a small group as they played with colorful blocks, animals and cars. Another Educator sat at a table with a small group of infants as they painted. Later in the morning once all groups were finished eating snack, they prepared to go outside. The transition outside was smooth.</p>

General Comments

Only positive child guidance was observed during today's Monitoring Inspection. Educators were seen offering hugs, praise and giving high fives to celebrate the children's accomplishments. The indoor environment was bright and welcoming. Preplanning was observed in each classroom. Age-appropriate artwork and family pictures were displayed throughout. In the 2year-old classroom a large board titled "Our Learning Journey" displayed pictures of the children with the peers and short write ups detailing what the children have been interested in.
