Pre-school children and school age children were observed both in the inside and outside environments.

Pre-school children were observed playing with playdough, lego, stringing beads onto pipe cleaners, painting, coloring, and playing dress-up. Educators were observed spread out in the classroom, allowing proper supervision of all children. Educators were observed playing with the children. Ongoing nature documentation was displayed in the classroom that reflects the children's current learning.

After-School Room One: Children were observed playing darts, lego, messy play with flour, and in the dramatic play center coffee shop. Educators were observed playing with the children. Licensing staff had conversations with the educators about adding more documentation and pictures of the children around the room.

After-School Room Two: Children were observed making rings out of pipe cleaners, using scratch art, doing puzzles, and playing with some new materials that the educator recently added to the room such as: Suction cups and bead puzzles. Educators were observed playing with the children.
