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General Comments

Upon licensing staff arrival for the renewal inspection, children were engaged in circle time and preparing to do an activity. Circle time consisted of talking about the days and months, as well as the weather. The children then sat at the tables where they drew their own police badges, as the police were coming for a visit later that morning. During the activity, educators asked questions about what the children knew about police officers.

The other preschool group was also engaged in circle time, participating in an interactive song about animals and acting them out while dancing around. Both groups then transitioned outdoors by getting their water bottles, shoes, and first aid kits. The two groups had their own designated outdoor play areas.

One group was engaged in pretend play with a wooden "car seat" and a steering wheel, pretending to drive around. Some children were playing in the sandpit, while others were running around and using the play structures. In the other group, children were engaged on the monkey bars. The topic of Spiderman came up, and educators asked the children if they were Spiderman themselves and engaged in pretend play with them. Another educator was setting up an invitation to play with paint and a large rock for the children to paint together outside.

It was then time for the police visit. The police arrived with their vehicle and introduced themselves and explained what they do. The children were able to explore the police car and press the different sound buttons. Children who did not want to participate in the activity were not required to do so and were comforted by educators if the sounds scared them.

The children had a later lunch than usual due to the police visit, and the schedule was adjusted to accommodate the activity. The children cleaned up the outdoor play area and came inside, washed their hands, and ate lunch before nap and quiet time. Cots were set up, and quiet music was played by the educators. During lunch, the educator facilitated a discussion about the police car and asked the children what their favourite part was.

Staff and child files were checked. Please ensure that professional learning hours are met and that required educators complete the required 10 hours per licensing year.

General Comments

Only positive child guidance was observed during the inspection.

Licensing staff recommends the program for renewal.
