Comments: Licensing staff observed mark-making materials in the infant classroom however, the materials were being stored high on a shelf and not accessible to the children. Mark-making materials need to be accessible to the infants.								

## **General Comments**

Licensing staff arrived at the licensed facility to conduct the License Renewal Inspection.

Licensing staff arrived as the infants were transitioning indoors from the outdoor play environment so the preschool and school-aged children to go outside to play.

When the infants got indoors the educator did diaper changes and washed the children up before engaging in free play activities.

Licensing staff observed the school-aged and preschool children while they were engaging in outdoor free play activities. Some children were playing on the stationary equipment while others played in the sandbox. When it was time to go inside and wash up for lunch, each group exited the outdoor play environment and lined up along the wall to ensure all children were accounted for and then made their way inside. Licensing staff observed educators counting numerous times to ensure they had all children in their group. Once indoors, the children went to the bathroom to wash up. After the children ate their lunch, those children who were going to nap, went onto their cots while other children played quietly.
