Children were observed in play alongside their educators. Children were observed to have free choice of materials and equipment available to them and engaged in solitary and collaborative play throughout both environments.

Educators engaged with children at their level, asking open-ended questions and listening attentively as children spoke.

Documentation of children's learning posted at their level in the indoor play environments. As discussed during inspection, for long-term projects ensure documentation reflects the flow and learning of the project over time to ensure that it is current.

In the outdoor play environment, children have planted a flower garden and maintain and water it daily.

General Comments

A variety of toys and natural materials are available for the children in the fenced outdoor play area. They have also been taking advantage of the wooded area close to the centre for nature play.

As discussed with Administrator at time of inspection, children should be encouraged to value and care for the outdoor play area in the same way they do the indoor play area. Ensuring outdoor props and materials are displayed, organized and labelled supports maintenance and care of materials.

For play structure in the outdoor play area, ensure that encroachment and surfacing meet manufacturers requirements. You should also check with your insurance company to ensure it is covered if there is an incident.
