General Comments

Upon licensing staff's arrival for the annual renewal, children were observed gathered with the educator, building collaboratively with magnetic blocks on the floor. The educator interacted continuously with the children, offering affirmations about their creations and prompting learning by asking questions about the colors, shapes, and how the pieces fit together. One child was in the process of potty training; the educator provided consistent, calm reminders to let them know if the bathroom was needed and offered reassurance during the process.

The group then began preparing for outdoor time. Children lined up near the bathroom door within the educator's clear sight. Children sat with books while waiting their turn. Diaper changes were completed individually, hands were washed under supervision, and children were guided to change their shoes and put on their coats.

Outside, children engaged with a wide range of materials and activities. They explored toy animals, responding to the educator's questions about the animal types and the sounds they make. Children threw discs, filled bowls with rocks in the mud kitchen, played pretend cleaning in the playhouse, and took turns on the slide. Children moved between activities independently. Throughout outdoor play, the educator remained nearby, actively participating in conversations and facilitating opportunities to play.

The transition into lunch was smooth. Children washed their hands and sat at the table while the educator prepared lunches brought from home. Music played softly during lunch, and the educator conversed with the children about the afternoon's planned activities, encouraging them to express their preferences and ideas. Following lunch, children again lined up near the bathroom for diaper changes and potty use before rest time. All children napped except one, who engaged in a quiet drawing activity with the educator during nap time.

The indoor environment offered a broad selection of age-appropriate materials, including books, blocks, toy cats and other animals, a craft corner with various supplies, farm animal figures, and a range of musical instruments. Learning stories from the summer months were displayed on the walls, alongside photographs and children's artwork.

Positive child guidance strategies were observed throughout the visit. The educator consistently used patience, words of affirmation, and gentle encouragement, while supporting the development of independence.
