Comments: One staff file has an expired first aid certificate. All educators must hold a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate. The staff cannot be left alone with children until they have a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate.			
12(2) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that a criminal record check or a vulnerable sector check, as the case may be, and a check with the Department of Social Development is conducted on each individual before he or she becomes a staff member.	12(2)	Nov 21, 2022	
Comments: One staff is missing the vulnerable sector check. The staff was asked to leave the premises and will be able to return after receiving her vulnerable sector check. An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that a vulnerable sector check is conducted on each individual before he or she becomes a staff member.			
22 The daily routine of a licensed facility shall include (b) a period of rest for a length of time that meets the needs of each infant and preschool child receiving services at the licensed facility but that does not exceed two consecutive hours unless there is a written request from a child's parent or guardian to extend the length of time.	22(b)	Nov 21, 2022	
Comments: The inspector observed that the infants are showing signs of being tired: rubbing eyes, crying but are being made to wait to go to bed because it was not 12 o'clock yet. Children had to stay in their highchair even if they had finished their lunch until it was time to go to bed. When asked by the inspector about the nap time routine, the educators questioned in both infants' rooms stated it was not nap time yet and they have been told by the administrator that they can't put the children down for naps before 12 o'clock. The daily routine of a licensed facility shall include a period of rest for a length of time that meets the needs of each infant and preschool child. The inspector observed that when children are waking up, they are not allowed to get up and they have to stay on their nap mats or playpens until 2 pm. Children who do not rest the entire time are allowed to get up and play quietly or join other children who are not resting. A separate space is provided for children who do not nap, so they do not disturb resting children. Children who do not nap are not required to rest, but they may play quietly. The daily routine must be adjusted to ensure that the rest time meets the needs of each infant and preschool child.

Comments: The inspector audited 10 child files, one child file is missing a copy of proof of immunizations. The administrator must ensure that all child files are up to date.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (v) a copy of a criminal record check or vulnerable sector check, as the case may be.	24(1)(c)(v)	Nov 21, 2022	
Comments: One staff is missing the vulnerable sector check. The staff was asked to leave the premises and will be able to return after receiving her vulnerable sector check. An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that a vulnerable sector check is conducted on each individual before he or she becomes a staff member.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (vii) a copy of a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate for each administrator and educator.	24(1)(c)(vii)	Dec 02, 2022	
Comments: One staff file has an expired first aid certificate. All educators must hold a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate. The staff cannot be left alone with children until they have a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (f) daily attendance records of the children on forms provided by the Minister.	24(1)(f)	Nov 21, 2022	
Comments: While conducting the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the daily attendance records are not completed. The daily attendance records must be accurate and reflect all children present at any given time and showing all absences with the detailing the reason with the codes. The inspector observed that the daily attendance records sheet has been modified. The operator must use the daily attendance records provided by the Minister (Appendix 10 from the Operator Manual).			
31(4) An operator shall ensure that the outdoor play area of a licensed facility (b) consists of more than one surface to permit different types of play.	31(4)(b)	Nov 25, 2022	
Comments: While conducting the renewal inspection, the inspector observed the younger preschoolers plays in a fences playground that has only one surface. The educators inform the inspector that they go in another fenced playground that has different surfaces once in a while. An operator shall ensure that the outdoor play area of a licensed facility consists of more than one surface to permit different types of play at all times.			
33(2) Stationary equipment in the outdoor play area shall be surrounded by a protective surfacing and installed according to the manufacturer's instructions.	33(2)	Dec 02, 2022	
Comments: While conducting the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that there is missing some protective surfaces surrounding the stationary equipment. Stationary equipment in the outdoor play area shall be surrounded by a protective surfacing and installed according to the manufacturer's instructions.			
41(1) A licensed facility at which services are provided to children who wear diapers shall have a sturdy surface that is (c) located separate from the food preparation area and not used for serving food.	41(1)(c)	Nov 21, 2022	
Comments: While conducting the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that some food is stored in the infant bathroom. Food cannot be stored in a bathroom. The administrator must ensure that the food is removed and stored in another space.			
47(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall refuse admission to a child if satisfactory proof of the immunizations required by the Public Health Act or the regulations under that Act is not provided.	47(1)	Nov 25, 2022	
Comments: The inspector audited 10 child files, one child file is missing a copy of proof of immunizations. The administrator must ensure that all child files are up to date.
