During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed an educator leaving six children alone with an Inclusion Support Worker to retrieve a thermometer to check a child's temperature. The Quality Assurance Monitor discussed the situation with both the educator and the Inclusion Support Worker, clarifying that the Inclusion Support Worker does not count in the staff-to-child ratio and should have been the one to retrieve the thermometer instead. Both the educator and the Inclusion Support Worker acknowledged and agreed with this guidance. Additionally, the matter was discussed with the administrator. Deficiency is now compliant							

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor is on-site to conduct a monitoring inspection.

During the visit, the Quality Assurance Monitor verified that the indoor play area was safe, clean, and equipped with a variety of toys in sufficient quantity for the children present. Additionally, the Quality Assurance Monitor

audited 12 child records.

A discussion took place with the administrator regarding lunches being placed on tables an hour before mealtime. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed in two classrooms that educators had removed children's lunches from their lunch bags and placed them on the tables. When asked about mealtime, the educators stated that lunch is typically served between 11:15 and 11:30 AM, though it was only 10:00 AM at the time of observation. The Quality Assurance Monitor recommended that lunches only be taken out when children are ready to eat to prevent food from spoiling or being exposed to germs. The administrator inquired whether placing lunch bags on the tables before going outdoors was acceptable. The Quality Assurance Monitor confirmed that this was a better practice than leaving food exposed for an extended period.

During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed an educator changing a child's diaper and noted that the child did not wash their hands afterward. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the administrator that both children and educators must wash their hands after diaper changes. Additionally, the administrator was advised that encouraging children to wash their hands after diapering helps establish proper hygiene habits as they transition to potty training.

Regarding deficiency 22(5): When the Quality Assurance Monitor requested a specific staff file, the administrator stated that it was in another building and needed to be retrieved. The administrator immediately went to retrieve the file and provided it to the Quality Assurance Monitor. This deficiency is now in compliance.
