Comments: During the staff file review, the inspector noted that one staff member's CPR certification is not recognized by the Work Safe list provided. All staff are required to have a valid, provincially recognized CPR certification on file.

Comments: The inspector observed that the door to the storage area containing chemical products was left unlocked. As chemical products and cleaning supplies must be locked at all times, the inspector informed the administrator, who promptly locked the door. Deficiency is now compliant.			
40(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that personal belongings of a child receiving services at the licensed facility that are brought to the licensed facility, including combs, brushes, toothbrushes, towels, washcloths, bedding, pacifiers and soothers, are (a) labelled with the name of the child.	40(1)(a)	Jul 21, 2025	Jul 17, 2025
Comments: During the inspection, the inspector observed that one of the six children's water bottles in the classroom was not labeled. All children's belongings must be clearly labeled with their names. The inspector advised the educator, who then labeled the bottle. Deficiency is now compliant.			

### General Comments

During the inspection, it was observed that the inclusion support worker was left alone in the classroom. The educator had temporarily exited the room, leaving the inclusion support worker responsible for the group. It is

important that the inclusion support worker should not be counted in the staff-to-child ratio when they are assigned to a child who requires one-on-one support.

During nap time, it was observed that in one classroom one child was sleeping for more than two hours. The inspector had a conversation with the educator who explained that the child's parent had requested the child not to be woken up. The inspector informed the administrator to have a consent signed by the parents if they want their child to be sleeping for more than two hours.

On the first day of the inspection, the inspector observed a square marked with tape on the floor in one classroom, where children were observed to be only playing in that area. This was discussed with the administrator. On the second day, the taped square had been removed, and children were observed playing freely in multiple areas of the classroom.

The inspector reminded the administrator that stationary equipment areas must be surrounded by protective surfacing and that the rocks should be raked regularly to maintain safety.

In one classroom, the inspector observed a science experience being conducted by the educator with the children, demonstrating active engagement in learning. In another class, a directed activity was observed where the educator used tape to create roads on a table, allowing children to play with toy, cars and animals.

The ratio was respected throughout the inspection.
