The Quality Assurance Monitor was on site to conduct the renewal inspection.

Throughout the visit, child-to-staff ratios were maintained.

During the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed various parts of the daily routine, including children eating lunch, napping, engaging in free play indoors and outdoors, and having their afternoon snack.

A discussion took place between the Quality Assurance Monitor and the operator regarding meal times. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that the children began eating lunch at 10:50 a.m. and were in bed for nap

time by 11:10 a.m. The Quality Assurance Monitor inquired whether it was typical for lunch to be served this early. The operator explained that this was not the usual schedule but that they were short-staffed that day, which caused a disruption in the routine. The Quality Assurance Monitor noted that, according to the daily schedule, the children typically begin preparing for lunch at 11:00 a.m.—which includes using the washroom and washing hands—before sitting down to eat around 11:30 a.m. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the operator of the importance of maintaining a consistent daily routine and ensuring that meals and snacks are offered at appropriate times.
