

Early Learning and Childcare Facility Inspection Report

Type of Inspection: Monitoring Inspection

Pursuant to section 21 of the *Early Childhood Services Act*, operators of licensed early learning and childcare facilities must post their most recent inspection report in a clearly visible and prominent place in the facility.

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 Ratio was respected during the visit. Positive child guidance was witnessed during the visit. Indoor play area materials and equipment are varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present. The materials are easily accessible and maintained clean and in good repair. The daily activities are purposely planned and documented and responds to the needs and interest of each child. Different types of documentation are being used at the facility. Learning stories, ongoing projects, and white boards. The documentation demonstrates the children's interest and progress through time. The space between rest equipment is 46 centimetres. All nap equipment is washable and non-absorbent. Each child has its own individual space to put their belongings. Observations: Upon my arrival 2–4-year-olds were playing outside. All groups had lunch and a nap. Discussion with the administrator concerning the exterior parc, professional development hours, parent committee and the quality improvement plan. One educator presently is on a waiting list to complete her CPR course. The educator cannot be alone with a group, open or close the facility. Her certificate will be sent to the quality assurance monitor upon completing the course. 				
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
