General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on December 13, 2024.

Children were observed engaging in indoor free play. They appeared active and engaged in a variety of activities.

Educators shared that the children are currently very interested in creative projects, including constructing a gingerbread house out of cardboard and building forts using blankets and loose parts. During the inspection, educators were observed using positive language and providing gentle reminders to support the children's interactions and activities.

Parents of children attending the center are granted entry at any time, fostering an open and welcoming environment. Outdoor play occurs for at least one hour during each four-hour block of time when most children are present, weather permitting. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and documented, with the reports posted in a visible location.

The facility ensures compliance with licensing requirements by prominently displaying the license, current inspection reports, monitoring reports, and orders for compliance. The daily routine and evacuation procedures are also posted in clear and accessible locations. Learning and play areas are well-defined, and children's artwork is displayed throughout the facility, creating an inviting and child-centered environment. Traffic areas, including outdoor walkways, are clean and free of clutter, ensuring safety. Additionally, drinking water is provided throughout the day, and outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth.

Daily activities are intentionally planned and documented as part of the program, providing children with opportunities for individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are incorporated into the indoor environment, supporting the development of language and communication skills.
