General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on February 11, 2025.

Children were observed engaging in both indoor and outdoor free play. Educators shared that the children are currently very interested in weekly visits from Paul at the Belleisle Watershed Coalition, where they are learning about local flora and fauna. Other areas of interest include creating with loose parts and hot glue, constructing sleds from recyclables, and staying active outdoors in the snow.

Educators were observed engaging in meaningful discussions with the children by asking questions and expanding on the children's ideas. Outdoors, educators played an active role in supporting children's activities. The facility maintains a daily incident log, and parents are notified of incidents. Reportable incidents are documented with completed forms. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and posted. Required documents, including the license, current inspection report, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance, are displayed in a clearly visible location. The daily routine is also posted. Evacuation procedures are prominently displayed. Books have been carefully selected to reflect the children's interests.

The environment includes well-defined learning and play areas, and children's artwork is displayed throughout the facility. Traffic areas are kept clean, and outdoor walkways are clear and free of clutter. Toxic products, such as chemical cleaners, are securely locked and inaccessible to children. Drinking water is available throughout the day. Daily activities are purposefully planned and documented in the program. Opportunities are available for both individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are incorporated throughout the indoor environment.
