General Comments

Comments:

Child to staff ratio was more than met today.

Children were eating snack when licensing staff arrived. Educators were sitting at the table with children and they washed their hands afterwards. Children go to the reading corner after snack for circle time. They began with attendance by the educator holding a laminated card with individual children's names and saying the name and signing a song, then the child put their name on the wall. Children were a bit active today, so the educator followed their lead and engaged in some exercises before reading. The educator took their time reading and responding to children's questions and observations linking to home experiences. After reading, each child shared what they did last night and then got ready to go outside. The children are familiar with the routine. Children and educators washed their hands numerous times.

Ensure each child has proof of immunizations or an exemption in their child files.

The environment has the curriculum areas represented and resources accessible to children. Each area is labelled with print and photos. There is a visual schedule posted at the door on one room with times, print, and photos, the pieces are on Velcro allowing flexibility in the schedule. Children's artifacts are posted throughout the centre showing open-ended invitations and value of the children's literate identities. Evidence of a learning experience of "Let's make a bread monster!" was posted on a bulletin board with children's artwork, quotes from the children on separate paper, an exciting word list heard during this experience, as well as predictions from children, the results based on children, and instructions for the creation of the bread monster.

Classroom rules are posted and were created with children, a huge family wall with family photos and an additional connection to families in the main room with names and drawings. Children's interests and preferences such as favorite foods and stores are posted throughout the room connecting environmental print and valuing children.

Educators are quick to respond to children with cuddles, time, and discussion. They gave children vocabulary to resolve disagreements and stayed with any problems, such as the dump truck allowing children to express
