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<p>General Comments</p> <p>2's Room The QAM observed children engaged in both snack time and free play. One child experienced difficulty transitioning back into the learning environment after being absent for several days due to illness. Educators provided positive child guidance, offering comfort and individualized attention to support the child's transition. Other children were observed engaging in a pretend birthday celebration with dolls, while an educator interacted with a child using magnet tiles. Educators remained consistently engaged with children throughout the observation.</p> <p>The learning environment displayed documentation on the walls and was well-equipped with materials for dramatic play, heavy-work building, sensory exploration, art, and block play. During the outdoor observation, the area included hammocks, slides, a dramatic play kitchen, trucks, tables, and chairs. The QAM identified a broken plastic chair and damaged plastic bowls with sharp edges and informed administration that these items needed to be removed for safety.</p> <p>Infant Room The QAM observed infants having snack while seated in a circle facing one another. Educators provided support during eating and interacted appropriately with the infants. As most infants were not yet walking, educators remained on the floor with them following snack time to support engagement and supervision.</p> <p>¾ Room The QAM observed children preparing to go outdoors. Many children dressed independently, with educators offering positive guidance and support as needed. Children were cheerful, laughing, and showing the QAM their "strong muscles." The outdoor play area included dramatic play materials, trucks, cars, snow shovels, and a slide.</p> <p>Room 4</p>
