| <p>Regular monitoring inspection was performed. Upon arrival there was a notice posted on the door as per policy, informing of two communicable diseases.</p> <p>Children were having their snack at the table. Educators disinfected the tables after children finished eating. Children were transitioned into bathroom and diapering routine. Those who waited were engaged in self-directed play throughout the room. Educator helping with bathroom routine washed her hands and disinfected the changing pad in between each child.</p> <p>Children proceeded to the outdoor play area with swimsuits on and participated in water play. Educators were heard counting the children out loud when transitioning to outdoor play and communicated well with each other about how many children each of them were bringing outside.</p> <p>Preschool children had their morning snack outside at the picnic table in the outdoor play spaces. Children were also in their bathing suits and sun screened. Educators explained they wanted to spend their morning outside as the afternoon is supposed to be very hot today. Preschool children requested to play "the floor is lava" and the educators participated and played along with them. All children join in on this activity and appeared to enjoy it</p> |

very much. Children then began filling the water play table themselves and educators brought over boats and other items to expand on this play.

The infant room had many Talk With Me resources posted throughout the room. The room was clean, bright and well organized. The infants had a separate outdoor play area from the older children, and it contained developmentally appropriate materials for the infants.

One child was not signed out on Monday or Wednesday and one child was not signed in on Tuesday. The paper attendance is required to be accurate at all times. Please review the attendance throughout the day to ensure it is up to date.
