Comments: All toxic products were locked by a key during the visit. Deficiency is now compliant

Comments: The inspector observed that 4 out of 6 water bottles are still not labelled with the name of the child. Inspector told the educators and then told the administrator that it needs to be labelled before the end of the visit. The educators then labelled the water bottles on site. Deficiency is now compliant
