<b>Comments:</b> The Inspector reviewed 15 child profiles and noted that one profile listed two emergency contact persons who reside more than one hour from the center. In a second instance, another child profile listed only one emergency contact person. The operator must ensure that all child profiles include the name, address, and telephone number of at least two individuals authorized by the child's parent or guardian to pick up the child and to be contacted in the event of an emergency when the parent or guardian cannot be reached. These emergency contacts must be within one hour of the center.			
33(3) An operator of a licensed facility shall complete a monthly review and maintenance plan on all stationary equipment that includes the following information: (a) the review and repair dates; (b) the action required and the action taken; and (c) the name of the staff member who conducted the review.	33(3)	Mar 25, 2026	
<b>Comments:</b> The Inspector observed that a monthly inspection was completed for outdoor toys and materials requiring repair; however, documentation was not available to demonstrate that a monthly inspection and maintenance plan is in place for stationary playground equipment. The operator is required to ensure that a monthly inspection and maintenance plan is completed and documented for all stationary equipment. The plan must include the date of inspection, identified hazards or required repairs, corrective actions taken, and the name of the staff member who completed the inspection.

<b>Comments:</b> Inspector observes a bottle of Lysol wipes on a shelf in in one group and a bottle of shaving cream on a shelf in another group. Operator is to ensure that all toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies are locked and inaccessible to children. Administrator locks the toxic products immediately. Deficiency is now compliant.			

General Comments

The inspector is on site to conduct the annual renewal inspection and observes the children engage in outdoor play in the morning, followed by lunch and the scheduled rest/nap period. Some children did not want to nap and were offered calm activities they could do on their nap mats.

In the afternoon, children are observed having their snack prior to transitioning into indoor activities. Observations include the educators actively participating with the children in a farm sensory activity using colored water and an interactive animated animal book.

In another program group, educators were observed actively engaging with children, offering a variety of stationary activities such as building blocks, a road map with toy cars and trucks, and a large print puzzle.

To end the day all groups are observed going outdoors as parent's begun to pick up the children.

The Inspector verifies the programming and documentation of daily activities and observes that it is well maintained and demonstrates meaningful evidence of children's learning and development. The Inspector had a discussion with the administrator regarding the importance of ensuring that learning stories and supporting documentation are consistently dated, as this supports accurate observation, tracking of progress, and review during the renewal inspection period.
