General Comments

Children and educators were observed engaged in a variety of activities this afternoon including basketball, sewing and board games. The environment is set-up with a variety of materials and invitations for the children to explore freely.

Classroom Environment:

Rug in Dramatic Play Area does not have anti-slip grip underneath. Anti-slip pad to be added or rug to be removed and replaced. Floors are accumulating debris - paper shreds, sand/mud, food crumbs, and pieces of play materials. Floors to be swept and mopped regularly. Clutter is accumulating throughout the environment especially in the corners of the room. Play materials are unorganized within bins/shelving and are not divided into defined interest centers. The environment is to be decluttered, organized and set-up in a way that encourages children to engage in play.

Currently this group does not have permanent educators, staff working have been inconsistent for a number of weeks. Consistent staff are needed to improve this environment and create a routine with the children. During inspection it was observed that educators and children are not familiar with each other or the daily routines.

Crackers and cucumbers were served for snack. Children were observed grabbing snack from snack bags without washing their hands first, some children were eating off the table. Ensure utensils are added to allow children to serve themselves without putting their hands in the food. Ensure children have plates or paper towel to put their snack on, rather than the table.

Monthly fire drills are documented.

Daily attendance records are accurate and reflect all children present. Child-to-staff ratio was observed to be met during Monitoring Inspection.

New staff file (2) review was completed. One First Aid/CPR certificate on file was expired; QA Monitor was able to confirm valid First Aid/CPR on staff's phone. Ensure certificate is added to file on site.
