General Comments

Children were in the outdoor play space upon arrival of licensing staff and they were observed transitioning to indoors. Children followed their educators into the indoor play area and displayed that they have a well-established routine.

New materials have been added to the infant room which include a large mirror that has been secured to the wall and a large wooden desk. The infants were observed finishing their meal and the educators were observed cleaning the infants faces and changing them before their nap time. The infants transitioned well to nap time as they walked to their nap room with their educators. The nap room was observed to be well maintained, clean and organized.

Infant educators were utilizing webbing to map the interests of each child who attended. This displayed that educators are observing the infants and their interests. The educators shared that they also speak with parents about the specific interests of the infants and establish their activities around these interests.

Wooden structure in two- and three-year-old room needs to be pulled further from the wall and mats need to be placed under the structure within fall zones to protect children from potential injury.

Documentation of learning was well displayed throughout the facility. Some educators are taking a long-term course which they are linking to the New Brunswick Curriculum.

Positive behaviour guidance was observed at all times and all children appeared to be engaged and content throughout the monitoring inspection.
