General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on February 20, 2025.

Children were observed both indoors and outdoors and during snack time.

Educators reported that the children have been particularly interested in Valentines Day art, group art projects with paint, climbing on climbers and sledding outdoors. When indoors, the educators played an active role in the children's activities, supporting both their exploration and physical play.

The daily incident log is maintained, and parents are promptly informed of incidents through completed incident report forms for reportable events. Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour within each four-hour block when the majority of children are in attendance, weather permitting.

Rest periods are tailored to meet individual children's needs and do not exceed two consecutive hours. All nap equipment meets the required thickness of at least 5 cm. Snacks are provided at intervals of no more than three hours apart, with meals offered at recognized meal periods.

The changing area is positioned within a meter or less from a sink, and diaper-changing procedures are clearly posted and visible to staff performing diaper changes. Infant bottles are properly labeled for individual use, and the infant outdoor play area is used at different times or separated from other children's play areas.

Children's portfolios are being maintained, allowing for reflection on their own learning. Multiple forms of documentation were observed throughout the facility, highlighting the ongoing curriculum work. Educators are
