## **General Comments**

Upon Licensing staff arrival, the children were preparing to go outdoors to play.

The outdoor space was large and fully fenced. There was ample natural shade from trees throughout the space and under the play structure. Daily attendance, emergency contacts and water bottles were taken outdoors. There was a large storage shed with extra play material that the children would actively choose items from and there was a first aid kit attached to the wall.

While outdoors, the children were observed playing with hula hopes, balls, kites, a wagon, shovels, trucks and train tracks. Children enjoyed picking flowers, digging in the sand, and selling pretend ice cream from the wagon. Educators were engaged with the children at their level in play and conversation. There were opportunities for problem solving, creative and imaginative play as well as exploration. Later in the morning, an Educator was observed blowing bubbles with the children and asking them questions about shadows and different shapes.

The transition between outdoor play and lunch time was smooth and there was evidence of daily routine. An Educator gave the children a reasonable time frame for cleaning up toys up and coming indoors. The indoor space was bright and inviting. There was a large wooden block station, bins of loose play pieces and openended material, art easels, books, play costumes, a car garage, board games, and a terrarium with stick bugs. Before lunch, the children washed their hands and sat together at the table. Educators were observed sitting with the children while they ate.

After lunch, the children played with wooden blocks and created a large store with items for sale. Educators assisted in completing puzzles chosen by the children and were observed setting up wooden puzzles with spelling words and a water table for fishing. Educators were observed singing fishing songs with the children and asking questions about the fish they caught. Later in the afternoon, the children coloured and created a craft with foam pieces and cut-outs.

During inspection, child and staff files were verified and the parent board was clearly visible in the hallway with required documentation. Monthly fire drills and playground maintenance checks are being completed, allergies
