General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on April 24, 2025.

All children present were within ratio and were observed during both indoor and outdoor free play. The operator stated that the children are currently very interested in making ramps for monster truck cars, exploring tape during open-ended art experiences, riding bikes outside, and engaging with nature. Operator was observed using positive language and giving gentle reminders.

Positive child guidance techniques were observed. Operator was seen engaging at the children's level, providing appropriate supervision, using encouraging language, offering choices, and assisting children with decision-making. Outdoors, the operator played an active role in the children's activities.

The daily incident log is consistently maintained. Parents of children present at the center are granted access at any time. Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour in each four-hour block when the majority of children receiving services are present, weather permitting. Monthly emergency evacuations are completed as required.

The home maintains a clearly visible and prominent space for posting the license, current inspection report, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. All nap equipment meets the requirement of being at least 5 cm in thickness. Snacks are provided at intervals no longer than three hours apart, and meals are served during recognized meal periods. The daily routine and weekly menu are both posted. Evacuation procedures are posted in a prominent location within the home.

Books that reflect the children's interests have been thoughtfully selected. There are several well-defined learning centers including areas for building, reading, dramatic play, and science. The environment includes well-organized learning and play areas, and children's artwork is displayed throughout the space.

Traffic areas are kept clean, and outdoor walkways are free of clutter. Toxic products such as cleaning agents are securely locked and inaccessible to children. The changing area is located within one metre of a sink, and diaper changing procedures are clearly posted and visible to anyone completing a diaper change. Drinking water is readily available and provided throughout the day.

General Comments

Opportunities for both individual and group experiences are evident. Various forms of literacy are integrated into the indoor environment. Children's portfolios are actively being developed and are accessible to them. Several forms of documentation were observed throughout the home, showcasing the learning experiences taking place. Webs have been created in collaboration with the children and have been expanded upon to reflect ongoing interests and learning.
