General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on October 18, 2024.

The children were observed during both their transition to outdoor and indoor playtime. During snack time and the transition inside, proper handwashing protocols were followed. Steps and platforms were in place, enabling the children to access regular-sized toilets and sinks, ensuring their independence and hygiene.

The educator shared that the children are currently engaged in outdoor activities, STEM projects, such as an exploding pumpkin experiment, and dramatic play, enhanced by new costumes. During interactions, the educator used positive language and offered gentle reminders to guide the children's behavior, fostering a supportive and encouraging environment.

The facility maintained a daily incident log and ensured that outdoor play occurred for at least one hour during every four-hour block, weather permitting. The license, inspection reports, and orders for compliance were posted in a prominent, visible location. The daily routine and evacuation procedures were also clearly posted, ensuring transparency and preparedness. The classroom was well-organized, with materials thoughtfully arranged to encourage play and exploration. Books that reflected the children's interests were readily available, and several well-defined learning centers were set up, including spaces for building, reading, dramatic play, and science. Traffic areas, both indoors and outdoors, were clean and clutter-free, and toxic products were securely locked and inaccessible to the children. Additionally, the outdoor stationary equipment had protective surfacing of appropriate depth to ensure the children's safety.

The curriculum provided opportunities for both individual and group experiences, with various forms of literacy present in the indoor environment. The children were encouraged to express their creativity, explore arts and sciences, experience accomplishments, problem-solve, and develop trusting relationships. A conversation with the onsite educator highlighted the importance of displaying the children's artwork in the room, and it was noted that the wooden planks in the outdoor area were beginning to splinter. The administrator is aware of the issue and plans to address it promptly.
