General Comments

A renewal inspection occurred on February 27, 2026.

All early learning and childcare learning environments were inspected.

In Infant 1 room, Inspector observed documentation on the walls supporting the children's sensory exploration. Pictures and learning stories of the children engaged in exploring paint and water, exploring a tuff tray, and going on neighborhood walks were observed. Samples of the children's open-ended art were observed displayed on the walls. Educators were observed by the inspector conducting and documenting 15-minute checks on infants sleeping in the nap room, following diaper-changing routines and handwashing. Children were also observed by the Inspector during lunch and afternoon snack, engaged in the kitchen center in the learning environment playing with real pots, pans and utensils. Inspector also observed the educators singing to the children numerous times throughout the day.

Inspector observed the children in Infant 2 room. Documentation displayed on the walls shows the children exploring paint with loose parts, creating pieces of art, painting with plastic eggs, reading books in the cozy corner, and exploring spider toys made from plastic bottles, cardboard and google eyes. Children were also observed during outside play, lunch, nap/quiet time, and afternoon snack.

Inspector observed children in the Junior Pre K room arriving back to the childcare center from a neighborhood walk. The children were also observed during lunch, preparing for and having nap/quiet time and preparing for afternoon snack, inside and outside play. Documentation on the walls in this learning environment depict the children exploring paint using different mediums such as bows and fingers instead of brushes. A learning story on the wall was observed by the Inspector showing the children exploring different textures and tastes of food and exploring musical instruments.

In the Pre K room, inspector observed the children returning from a neighborhood walk, engaged inside play, having lunch, nap/quiet time, afternoon snack and preparing for outside play. Documentation on the walls in this room support the children's current interests and learning. Pictures and

stories of the children exploring bubbles and creating bubble art, creating their own town by using mark making materials and paper to create "Chicken Nugget Town."

Inspector observed children who nap in this room have a space crated for the in a quieter area of the room, while the other children who do not nap engage in quieter activities such as art and magnet play.

In the school-age room, Inspector observed the children arriving from school. The educators were observed engaged with the children in a game of cards.

Documentation displayed on the walls show the children engaged in a game they created of "Pin the tail on the polar bear," creating butterflies from construction paper and chalk and exploring and creating salt paintings using glue, salt, and watercolors.

Handwashing was observed by the Inspector occurring numerous times during the inspection.

Discussed with Administrator the use of Appendix 6: Consent to Administer Medication—On Going Treatment. This is to be used for medication when there is not a definite end date for the prescribed medication. For example, a puffer to be used as needed by the child.

All staff files were reviewed and verified complete. Facility is meeting the requirement of Administrator and 50% of the educators to have completed their Early Childhood Education Certificate or equivalent.

Administrator has submitted a plan, to the inspector, for staff to complete the mandatory ten (10) hours of Professional Learning that is required, prior to the license expiration date of April 30, 2026.

Inspector observed the educators in all the learning environments, speaking kindly and appropriately to the children, tending to their needs and following positive child guidance techniques.
