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<p>General Comments</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection -In all group ratio was respected during the visit -Posted at front and back entrance in the cubbies area are the following documents: The license, inspection report, orders for compliance, daily routine, evacuation procedures, name of administrator, name and telephone number of QA Monitor and inspector - Life threatening allergies -When it applies a notice to inform parents of the existence of a communicable disease is posted on entrance doors. -The following administrative records are maintained on site: Daily attendance of children and staff, monthly emergency evacuation fire drills, smoke alarm, smoke detectors and fire extinguisher inspection and maintenance records -Monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills are completed -An exemption form was sent to the operator, for financial records that are kept else where then the center. -A daily review is done of the outside space to ensure that all material is safe, but monthly the administrator will go in and do a full review and maintenance on all equipment -During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way -Children's indoor play area is safe and clean. - Material and equipment proposed to children in the indoor play area are easily accessible on low, open shelves. It is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present. -Toxic products, and cleaning supplies are locked under key and are inaccessible to children -A challenge was given to all staff to create literate identity through outdoor winter play, staff have all join in the challenge and made it theirs by creating activities by exploring art, drama, print, math and music. In all rooms, evidence of children's learning is posted either with, webbing, photos and learning stories. <p>Observations: When arriving at the center all children were playing outside, they came in had a short free play period to then transitioned to lunch time and nap time for the younger children. The older kids were either having a rest period or playing quiet games, sensory tray, table games...etc. during nap time.</p>
