- -Late afternoon visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection
- -Ratio was respected during the visit
- -The educator has a valid first aid certificate
- -Review and discussion about the major incident report form. It was discussed with the director what incident is considered reportable
- -Minor incident reports are maintained in the child's file
- -Educators mentioned which play structure they avoid since there is no protective surfacing
- -Outdoor material is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present
- -Outdoor play area is maintained safe and free of hazards
- -Posted in a visible and prominent place in the facility are the following documents: The license, inspection report, daily routine, evacuation procedures, name of administrator, name and telephone number of QA Monitor and inspector Life threatening allergies and when it applies a notice to inform parents of the existence of a communicable disease.
- -During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations.
- -Children's indoor play area is safe and clean
- Material and equipment proposed to children in the indoor play area are easily accessible on low, open shelves. It is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present.
- -Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child

Observations: When arriving at the center children were finishing their snack, once they were done, they transitioned into free play, some made forts, others were working on a Lego project or building a second fort and playing with Play-Doh. Half of the group went outside to do drawing in the outside classroom will the other half stayed in working on their project.
