General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on February 6, 2025.

Children were observed engaging in indoor free play, exploring various activities that foster creativity and social interaction. Educators noted that the children are currently very interested in crochet, Beyblades, puzzles, art, and fort-building outside with snow. Throughout the observation, educators were seen using positive language and providing gentle reminders to guide children's behavior. They played an active role in children's activities, fostering engagement and meaningful interactions.

The facility maintains a daily incident log, and parents are informed of incidents as they occur. In the event of a reportable incident, an incident report form is completed. Parents of children attending the center have unrestricted access to enter at any time. Outdoor play is incorporated for at least one hour in each four-hour block when the majority of children are present, weather permitting. Monthly emergency evacuation drills are conducted and posted. Essential documentation, including the facility's license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance, is displayed in a clearly visible location.

The daily routine is posted, along with evacuation procedures, which are prominently displayed. Life-threatening allergies are also clearly posted for awareness. The room is thoughtfully arranged to create an inviting atmosphere, with materials set up to encourage play. The facility provides a diverse selection of age-appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys.

Traffic areas are well-maintained, and outdoor walkways remain clean and free of clutter. Toxic products, such as chemical cleaners, are securely locked and inaccessible to children. Drinking water is available throughout the day. Outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth to ensure safety.

Children have opportunities for both individual and group experiences. The curriculum supports creative expression, exploration of the arts and sciences, problem-solving, and opportunities to experience accomplishments. Additionally, it fosters the development of trusting, respectful, and supportive relationships.
