General Comments
<p>A Monitoring Inspection took place on April 11, 2025.</p> <p>During the visit, children were observed engaged in indoor and outdoor free play, as well as during snack time.</p> <p>The operator shared that the children are currently interested in collaborative art painting projects, sensory encounters with clay in a sensory tray, exploring the properties of loose parts in the outdoor environment, and engaging in dramatic play with costumes. On the day of the inspection, a child was celebrating their birthday, which became the focal point of the day's activities. The operator was observed using positive language and offering gentle reminders, contributing to a warm and respectful tone throughout the space. Additionally, the operator has included their own interests and experiences within the documentation, offering a personal and relational connection to the learning environment.</p> <p>Families are welcomed into the facility and have access at any time during the day. The license and the most recent inspection report are posted in a clearly visible and prominent location. Emergency evacuation</p>

## General Comments

procedures are clearly posted and easy to locate. The room is inviting, with thoughtfully arranged materials that encourage exploration and creativity. Books have been chosen to reflect the children's current interests, and children's artwork is proudly displayed throughout the environment. The facility offers a wide variety of appropriate materials, books, toys, and equipment that support developmental needs. Traffic areas inside and outdoor walkways are kept clean and free from clutter. Toxic products such as chemical cleaners are stored securely and are inaccessible to children. Diaper changing procedures are clearly posted and visible during diaper changes, and drinking water is made available to children throughout the day.

Various forms of literacy are present within the indoor environment, supporting children's communication and language acquisition. The operator extends curriculum to the outdoor space and makes meaningful efforts to bring elements of the natural world into the classroom, creating a cohesive and enriching experience for children. A conversation took place with the operator regarding the strengths and needs of the facility. Strengths include a well-organized and well-resourced indoor environment that offers a wide range of materials to support children's learning. Areas identified for growth include ensuring that all food brought from home is labelled with the child's name and refrigerated when necessary. Infant bottles should be clearly labelled and capped when not in use. A change pad will be required for infant diaper changes, and supervision of children must be maintained at all times. Diaper changes should occur in an area that allows for direct supervision of all children while remaining near a sink for handwashing. When children are present in the kitchen, they must be actively supervised. Daily sheets must be completed throughout the day to remain current, and children's hands should be washed prior to transitioning to eating activities.
