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General Comments

Upon licensing staff arrival, groups were transitioning to snack time. Children were observed washing their hands, retrieving their lunch boxes, and sitting at the tables. Educators supported the routine and supervised attentively.

After snack, children engaged in free play using the indoor materials and resources available. They were observed playing with the ball pit, mini figures, stuffed toys, and blocks. Educators were observed gently guiding infants to the bathroom for handwashing and diaper changes. Diaper change documentation was completed following care routines.

The mixed-age group was observed participating in circle time. Activities included a large letter cube game, where children took turns tossing the cube and associating each letter with words. Educators encouraged conversation and participation throughout the activity. An educator then read a story to the group, followed by a movement activity where children invited peers to imitate their own dance or yoga poses.

The mixed-age group and the two-year-old group then transitioned outdoors. The two-year-old group brought kitchen materials outside to engage in pretend play, later describing to the Inspector what they "made" with the snow upon returning indoors. The outdoor environment was appropriately set up to encourage active play, including running and exploration. Educators assisted children with dressing for outdoor play, and all children were dressed appropriately for the weather.

The infant group transitioned to lunch after engaging in age-appropriate morning activities. They washed their hands and sat at the table for lunch. During this time, cots were set up, and infants over 15 months of age rested on their individual cots for nap time, using their own blankets and comfort items from home. The mixed-age group and two-year-old group also returned indoors for lunch and subsequently rested on their cots during quiet time.

After nap, the infants transitioned outdoors. Educators assisted them in dressing appropriately. Infants were observed running, climbing, and playing in the snow before returning indoors for afternoon snack.

General Comments

Throughout the visit, only positive child guidance practices were observed. First aid kits were consistently available both indoors and outdoors. Fire drills are conducted monthly. Staff and child files were verified.

Licensing staff recommends the program for renewal.
