Comments: During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that the most recent inspection report was not posted in a visible and prominent location within the facility. This was brought to the operator's attention. The operator retrieved the latest inspection report from the office and posted it in a visible and prominent place in the facility. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed a container of Lysol wipes, a bottle of windshield washer fluid, and a can of paint placed outside in front of the door used by children to access the outdoor play area. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the operator that all toxic products must be stored in a locked storage area secured by a key.

<p>he Quality Assurance Monitor was on site to conduct a monitoring inspection. Child-to-staff ratios were maintained throughout the visit.</p> <p>During the monitoring inspection, the following were verified:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Signed consents in the child's file</li> <li>•Indoor play area</li> <li>•Indoor play area materials and equipment</li> <li>•Personal belongings</li> <li>•Outdoor play area materials and equipment</li> </ul> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor observed children eating snacks and engaging in indoor play.</p> <p>While reviewing child records, the Quality Assurance Monitor noted that, in 3 of the 6 child files, the section for the medical practitioner was left blank. General Comments

Quality Assurance Monitor that the files missing this information were for the operator's own children, and that a sticky note had been added to the files as requested during the initial inspection. The Quality Assurance Monitor informed the operator that the sticky note was blank and clarified that it must indicate whether the children are on a waitlist for a medical practitioner or simply do not currently have one. It cannot be left blank. The operator confirmed that this information would be added to the note.
