General Comments
<p>A monitoring inspection was conducted today, during which children were observed in both indoor and outdoor environments. At the time of the inspector's arrival, the Pre-K room was outdoors while the administrator was engaged in reviewing new staff files with the inspector. Due to the scheduled pick-up time at 11:30 a.m., there was limited opportunity to observe the children in their learning environments.</p> <p>The Early Learning Room was observed in greater detail. Children were seen participating in outdoor play upon the inspector's arrival, followed by indoor activities and routines including lunch and nap time. The children ate lunches that were brought from home and clearly labeled. They engaged in conversations with educators and introduced themselves to the inspector.</p> <p>The indoor learning space featured a variety of creative and open-ended materials. One environment displayed open-ended art titled "Fall Leaf Creations," which included construction paper, googly eyes, pine cones, and popsicle sticks. Educators had documented the children's creative process through photographs and compiled these into a learning story. Additionally, sheer curtains painted by the children in vibrant colors added a personalized touch to the room to make it inviting.</p>

General Comments

Several learning invitations were set up throughout the space. One activity involved magnetic alphabet letters that children could match to corresponding laminated letters. The dramatic play area included dress-up clothing and a kitchen set stocked with pots, pans, play food, and utensils, encouraging imaginative exploration.

During the inspection, the operator engaged in a detailed conversation with the inspector regarding current challenges faced by the facility. Staffing shortages have required both the operator and administrator to work on the floor to maintain child-to-staff ratios. Despite multiple job postings and participation in a recent job fair, the facility continues to struggle with recruitment and daily operations.

The operator also discussed the need for inclusion support workers for specific children. Unfortunately, they have been unable to secure staff to meet these needs. Efforts are underway to develop individualized plans for each child requiring support, and the operator has reached out to consultants for guidance.

Two new staff members are currently working in the rooms but have not yet completed first aid certification due to limited course availability on the island. The operator confirmed that once eight participants are registered, facilitators will travel to the island to conduct the training. Licensing will be updated once the course date is confirmed and the staff have completed certification.

It was noted that educators without first aid certificates are not permitted to be left alone with children, which further necessitates the operator's presence on the floor. The inspector offered to return to provide on-the-floor support and assist with any questions the new staff may have.

Lastly, the parent board was reviewed and found to be complete; however, the name of the Quality Assurance Monitor has changed and will need to be updated. The operator acknowledged this and will make the necessary revisions.
