<p><b>General Comments</b></p> <p>A Monitoring Inspection occurred this afternoon, May 22, 2024.</p> <p>During the inspection, children were observed engaging in outdoor free play, nap time, and eating their afternoon snack. Educators reported that the children are currently very interested in gardening, planting seeds, water play, and catching bugs and insects. The outdoor play yard features vegetables planted by the children and educators, and an experiment was conducted to determine if tap water or rainwater would affect seed growth, demonstrating scientific inquiry. Educators were observed using positive language and giving gentle reminders, actively participating in children's activities outdoors. The curriculum provides opportunities for both individual and group experiences. Educators extend the curriculum outdoors and incorporate the natural world into the classroom, by sprouting seedlings indoors.</p> <p>The facility allows parents of children present at the center to enter at any time. Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour in each four-hour block when most children are in attendance, weather permitting. The daily routine is posted in each room, and a notice informing parents of the existence of a communicable disease is clearly visible. The facility has a varied supply of equipment, materials, books, with several learning centers,</p>

including building, reading and dramatic play. Toxic products such as chemical cleaners are locked and inaccessible to children. Drinking water is provided throughout the day. The infant outdoor play area is separate and used at different times than areas for older children. Outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth.
