<p>General Comments</p> <p>Monitoring Inspection:</p> <p>Infant Room: Children observed engaged in singing and reading with their educator this morning. Educator was sitting on the floor having meaningful conversations with the children about parts of the book she was reading. Books are displayed on shelves to invite children to read. Discussed with educator how a variety of interests could be represented in different types of documentation at the same time.</p> <p>Twos Room: Children and educators engaged in play this morning. Educator had an invitation set up at the table that invited the children to draw on a whiteboard. Educator was observed sitting at the table with the children listening to their conversations and asking them meaningful questions.</p> <p>Preschool Room:</p>
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General Comments

This morning the children in this room were invited by their educator to join him as he shared a story and he demonstrated a new building material (sturdy cardboard) that he was adding to the environment for them to explore. The children quickly developed an interest in this cardboard and began exploring and building with it.

Outdoor play was observed today. Many positive interactions were observed outdoors between children and educators. Nice to see educators engaged in play along with the children! The preschool children have been working on building a fort with their educators. The children were very proud their hard work and eager to show off what they had built.

Documentation is posted throughout each of the learning environments that demonstrate the children's learning and interests.

Hand washing routines observed today.

Open ended art materials can now be shared within each group; these items can be cleaned and sanitized at the end of the each day.
