All children must be signed in at arrival and signed out departure daily. Children who are attending for transition visits must be included on attendance form.

Comments: COVID-19 Recovery Phase: Children from 3 year old group mixed with children in the 4 year old group this morning. During this time children must be kept with their group using the grouping method to reduce contacts. Groups can not be reconfigured to accommodate low numbers or staffing issues.

Comments: Board on front of Mud Kitchen deck broken. To be repaired. Red tricycle with broken plastic seat. Educator removed this tricycle from outdoor play area during inspection.

Comments: Lysol disinfectant spray left on top of cubbies within child's reach.			

<b>General Comments</b>  Children engaged in both indoor play and outdoor play this morning.
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General Comments

Positive interactions were observed between educators and children.

A variety of materials are accessible for the children to engage with. Children have a large outdoor play area with a variety of mud kitchen materials and many toys that encourage gross motor play.

Hand washing routines observed today.

Educators observed sanitizing high touch areas frequently during visit.

Recommend reviewing use of attendance forms with educators to ensure that they are being completed properly.

Ensure evacuation procedure and drawing is posted at front door.
