Comments: Some parts of the floor within the indoor play area have been damaged due to water coming in. Operator has consulted with Public Health, who has advised that these floors need to be lifted/replaced. There is also a floor board that has lifted within the corner of the back side room (near construction area/train table)-to be repaired as well.

Comments: Upper wooden stair outside leading to entrance door is beginning to rot and pose a tripping hazard. To be replaced this spring/summer, once the ground thaws. Operator can provide inspector with an anticipated date for repair via email.

Comments: One board in the inside gate of the outdoor play area is damaged-to be replaced.			

General Comments
<p>Completed renewal inspection today. The children were observed within the indoor and outdoor environments. Hand washing, lunch time and rest time routines were observed.</p> <p>Both groups of children have access to a variety of materials to explore within their environments. Loose parts have been displayed in an inviting and organized way, and open ended art materials were plentiful.</p> <p>Current topics of interest include: storms, snow/building, colors, birds, and various forms of art (water color, clay). The children's open ended art and documentation to reflect these interests has been displayed throughout the rooms.</p> <p>Educators were observed pointing out observations to the children outdoors, reading to the children and interacting with them within interest centers. The children demonstrated additional interest in building with play</p>

dough, open ended art and exploring objects within the science area.

Discussed serving meals with operator. If facility is to continue with current practices of children bringing their own lunches, ensure an application for change is completed and sent to Quality Assurance Monitor. If operator resumes serving meals, please advise licensing at that time.

Discussed storage of the lunch boxes with administrator and operator at time of inspection. Recommended for these to be stored on a table/shelf within the older preschool children's room and that children collect these themselves rather than be passed specific foods/containers during meal times. This will allow the children to practice self help skills, make healthy choices and promote independence. Discussed the option of tying a pair of scissors close to the garbage can to support children in opening their snacks.
