General Comments

A monitoring inspection was conducted on August 20, 2025. Children were observed in their indoor environments during the afternoon, actively engaged in a variety of play-based learning experiences. Educators across all rooms demonstrated responsiveness to children's interests, creating environments enriched with relevant materials and documentation.

In the Ladybug Room, the theme of space exploration was prominently featured. Children enthusiastically shared their knowledge of the planets with the inspector, demonstrating a strong interest in astronomy. Educators supported this interest by incorporating fun facts into daily conversations and providing materials such as painted moon rocks in the sensory table, space-themed books, and materials to make a planet night light out of a battery candle and foam balls. Additionally, children showed curiosity about the concept of time. Educators responded by integrating visual timers, analog and digital clocks, and references to minutes and seconds throughout the environment to support early numeracy and time awareness.

In the Butterfly and Critters Room, children expressed interests in pirates, ocean life, and Disney animals. The environment reflected these themes through a sensory table filled with sand and colorful gems, ocean animal figurines, pirate-themed props, and Disney character plush toys. Documentation was present throughout the room, showcasing children's engagement in open-ended art activities. One notable example included painting and stamping with marshmallows, encouraging creativity and sensory exploration.

In the ASP (After School Program) Room, the theme for the week was "Water Week." Children were excited to share with the inspector their upcoming field trip to the Q-Plex for water play. On the day of the inspection, the theme was "Frozen Day," and children created icicles using tin foil, which they then painted blue. The room also reflected children's interest in bracelet-making, with various materials such as beads, string, and clasps available. Children were actively creating bracelets to "sell in the market," fostering entrepreneurial thinking and fine motor development. Family photos were displayed throughout the room, creating a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere that honored each child's background.

Children were observed practicing proper handwashing routines Ratios were met in all rooms, and educators demonstrated clea
