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General Comments
<p>Monitoring Inspection:</p> <p>Children and educators were observed engaged in a variety of activities this morning including gross motor play, exploring art materials, gym games, building with blocks and stories. The preschool children were observed gathered around a table exploring clay with their educator. Their educators engaged in meaningful conversations during play that expanded on their learning and exploration of art materials. A small group of children and their educator in the Twos Room were exploring cutting with scissors and peeling stickers. The infants were observed in the gym playing with balls and a small slide.</p> <p>Purposeful planning is evident through documentation and invitations set-up throughout the environments. A variety of documentation is displayed at the children's level and includes connections to the NB Curriculum Framework. Each environment has homemade books that support the children's interests accessible.</p> <p>Art materials in the Twos Room are becoming depleted, to be replenished throughout the day. Examples of materials to include, but are not limited to variety of paper in colours, textures and sizes, paint, paint brushes, paint rollers, mark making materials, glue, tape, feathers, tissue paper, cardboard tubes, fabric, yarn, ribbon, recycled items, items collected from nature, collage materials, etc. QA Monitor discussed art materials with staff during inspection and recommended adding cutting bin with a variety of materials for the children to explore with scissors as there is currently an interest in scissors within the group.</p> <p>QA Monitor discussed with administrator that the materials in the Preschool Room are becoming unorganized. Materials are to be organized on low open shelving within the interest centers. The children in this group are currently interested in block building and gross motor play; educators have expanded these areas to ensure there is adequate space for children to engage in these types of play. Ensure that Manufacture's Guidelines are reviewed to ensure material underneath climbing structure is appropriate.</p> <p>Homemade ham and corn chowder and biscuits were served for lunch.</p> <p>Handwashing routines were observed during washroom routines.</p>

Daily attendance records are accurate and reflect all children present. Child-to-staff ratio was observed to be met during Monitoring Inspection.
