A variety of age appropriate books to be added to the environment (indoor and outdoor).</p>

Children and educators engaged in play and conversation this morning. Educators observed encouraging children to problem solve issues that arise with their peers. Educators observed down at the children's level interacting with the children in a positive way.

Children have opportunities to explore nature and the community each day.

Ensure that the environment and materials are set up for the children indoors on rainy/hot days. Discussed having carts set up with materials that can be easily rolled into the environment with operator and educators.
