Ensure an Extreme Allergy Management and Emergency Plan (Appendix 4) is completed and kept with each Epi-Pen. The supervisor must ensure these are completed and with the educator at the beginning of each week of camp.

Recommending that a supervisor monitor toxic product storage on a daily basis going forward to ensure these
