Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed a child walk out of the classroom and into the hallway without supervision to get a book out of their backpack. During the inspection, an educator observed that the child was alone in the hallway and stepped out of the classroom and brought the child back to the classroom. Deficiency is now compliant.			
12(2) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that a criminal record check or a vulnerable sector check, as the case may be, and a check with the Department of Social Development is conducted on each individual before he or she becomes a staff member.	12(2)	Mar 22, 2024	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a new staff member did not obtain a check with Social Development prior to employment. The staff member cannot return to the facility during operating hours until a valid check with Social Development has been obtained. During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a new staff member did not obtain a criminal record check/vulnerable sector check prior to employment. The staff member cannot return to the facility during operating hours until a valid criminal record check/vulnerable sector check has been obtained.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (iii) a description of the staff member's duties and responsibilities.	24(1)(c)(iii)	Mar 12, 2024	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a description of duties and responsibilities is missing in 3 of 16 employee files audited. The operator must ensure that a copy of the description of duties and responsibilities is maintained in the staff's file.

Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a new staff member did not obtain a criminal record check/vulnerable sector check prior to employment. The staff member cannot return to the facility during operating hours until a valid criminal record check/vulnerable sector check has been obtained.

Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a new staff member did not obtain a check with Social Development prior to employment. The staff member cannot return to the facility during operating hours until a valid check with Social Development has been obtained.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (vii) a copy of a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate for each administrator and educator.	24(1)(c)(vii)	Mar 22, 2024	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the first aid certificate and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certificate of a staff member is not a 16-hour Standard First Aid with CPR Level C certificate issued from a recognized provider approved by Work Safety NB. The employee cannot be alone with the children until they obtain a first aid certificate and a cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) level C certificate from a trainer approved by WorkSafeNB.			
32(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide indoor play area materials and equipment that are (b) arranged on low, open shelves and accessible to the children receiving services at the licensed facility,	32(1)(b)	Mar 15, 2024	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that art materials are not accessible on low, open shelves for children in 2 of the 5 classrooms. The operator must ensure that a sufficient quantity of art materials and equipment are available for all children.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Mar 08, 2024	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed 4 cans of shaving cream and a bottle of Lysol all-purpose cleaner in an unlocked cabinet located inside a classroom. The operator must ensure that cleaning products are locked up and inaccessible to children.			
43 An operator of a licensed facility shall not permit hot beverages in areas that are occupied by the children receiving services at the licensed facility, including the outdoor play area.	43	Mar 08, 2024	Mar 08, 2024
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed a travel mug containing tea inside a locker in one of the classrooms. The operator must ensure that hot beverages are not observed in areas occupied by the children. Prohibiting hot beverages in the play areas reduces the risk of burns to children. During the inspection, the educator brought the tea to the staff room. Deficiency is now compliant.			
48(5) If more than one bottle-fed infant is receiving services at a licensed facility, the operator shall ensure that each bottle is (a) labelled with the child's name, (b) used only for the intended child.	48(5)	Mar 11, 2024	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed an unlabeled infant's bottle containing formula on a shelf in one of the classrooms .If more than one bottle-fed infant is receiving services at a licensed facility, the operator shall ensure that each bottle is labelled with the child's name.			

### General Comments

During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed snack time, indoor free play, lunch and quiet time. The inspector also observed educators reading books to children and a science activity during which children mixed colored vinegar into baking soda with transfer pipettes.

During the inspection the ground was snow covered; therefore, the park assessment will be conducted in the spring with a member of the licensing team.

The administrator informed the inspector that the information of the new board of directors has been sent to Service New Brunswick but that the information has not yet been updated online.
