The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site for a monitoring inspection.

The following elements were verified:

- Child to staff ratios
- New staff member's files
- Outdoor play area
- Daily activities
- Daily attendance of children

During the inspection, children were observed playing outdoors. The Quality Assurance Monitor also noted a group of children engaging with a sensory bin and participating in an activity focused on the color blue. Positive interactions were observed, including educators actively engaging in play with the children.

.The Quality Assurance Monitor observed, in the outdoor play area, the presence of stagnant water in tires. Stagnant water in an outdoor play area can pose several health and safety risks for children. To ensure a safe and hazard-free environment, the Quality Assurance Monitor recommends implementing a routine cleanup of the tires before children play with them.
