Comments: During the review of the employee's files, the inspector observed that one employee's CPR certificate is expired. All educators must hold a valid First Aid certificate and a valid CPR certificate placed in their files. The inspector informed the administrator, who enrolled the employee in a course. The inspector also reminded the administrator that until the employee provides an updated certificate, she cannot be left alone with the children.			

General Comments

The inspector is on site to conduct the renewal inspection.

During the visit, the inspector observed two classrooms returning to the facility from a walk. In one classroom, children and educators were dancing to music.

The inspector also observed lunch, rest period, afternoon snacks, outdoor play, and the arrival of school-age children at the facility.

A discussion is held with the administrator to clarify that eligible educators must complete the required 10 hours of professional development before the permit expiration date of December 31, 2025.

General Comments

Another discussion took place with the administrator regarding the outdoor play area for school-aged children. The designated area for school-aged children is the community park beside the facility. Since this park is not part of the daycare's facilities, it was not inspected during the renewal inspection. It is the operator's responsibility to ensure that the outdoor play area is safe for children. Any safety concerns must be communicated with the community so that corrective measures can be taken.

The ratio is respected throughout the inspection.
