<p><b>General Comments</b></p> <p>Licensing staff arrived in the morning and observed the children playing outside in their fenced outdoor play area. It was a mild and sunny Spring day and the children and educators were enjoying the positive change in the weather. The outdoor play area was well set up for the children's use, there are planters, 2 storage sheds, a climber with 2 slides, a wooden playhouse, a sun shelter for crafting/outdoor classroom, a mud kitchen and small tires to build with and a larger one, as well as a large sand box. There were plenty of balls, containers, art supplies, chalk, and a picnic table. The children were engaged in a variety of activities, balancing on a tree that was set up in the yard, playing imaginary games together, building things and/or making music with the wooden blocks. The educators were engaged in the children's play, and the environment was positive and pleasant. The children played cooperatively together and negotiated issues that came up among themselves. The environment is more natural and soothing than it used to be with its wooden fence, shredded tire surfacing, old trees and natural play items like wooden blocks.</p> <p>The transition from outside to inside was smooth and well-regulated with the youngest 2-year-old group going in first and then the 3-year-olds, and finally the oldest group, the 4-year-olds. Diapering, washing hands and bathroom breaks all took place calmly and then the children sat at tables in their rooms for lunch. All food is brought from home and prepared as needed by the educators and with help from the Director. The cots were set up for napping in the four-year-old room. Today the children who did not nap went outside for outside play but there is room to set up in the other classrooms if the weather is poor.</p> <p>In the afternoon invitations are set up in all the rooms and a variety of activities occur. The 3-year-olds were working on a bird's nest, the 4-year-olds are making papier mache vases for Mother's Day presents and the rooms are filled with Spring themed arts and crafts and music. The teepees in the 2- and 3-year-old rooms from the inclusion and diversity grant are very popular for reading and for some quiet time away from the main group. There were many colourful examples of the arts and crafts of the children and Spring was a strong interest in the facility.</p> <p>The child and staff files were reviewed and found to be complete. The attendance forms, first aid kits, fire drills, and outdoor maintenance plans were all up to date. The center was bright and clean and well organized with</p>
