General Comments					
During my renewal inspection of the centre I observed the indoor and outdoor play areas to be well-equipped with diverse activities including books, dress-up props, art supplies, and many different toys. Outdoors there					

with diverse activities including books, dress-up props, art supplies, and many different toys. Outdoors there were large spaces to run and jump, climbers, and swings. The spaces were well-maintained and organized. There was documentation of the children's learning visible in photos and art projects hanging from the windows and walls.

During the children's morning outdoor play children educators kept excellent sightlines and allowed the children to freely explore but were promptly responsive when the children needed their support with resolving conflicts or managing emotions. They got down on the children's level and helped them negotiate solutions with each other.

I observed educators reading to children during transitions while they awaited the rest of their group to be done getting cleaned up and ready for lunch. They played music and sang with the children. Educators and other staff worked together as a team to keep transitions running smoothly.

Educators celebrated the children's successes like completing their own hygiene activities, cleaning up or resolving conflicts with peers. Educators were consistently supportive and engaged with the children, speaking in positive, calm tones and provided prompts to support the children in transitions (i.e., five-minute warnings, verbally prompting clean-up).

I recommend their renewal pending the annual health inspection.
