General Comments

Licensing staff arrived at the licensed facility on May 11, 2022 at 8:00am to conduct a follow-up inspection. When licensing staff arrived onsite, the children were still arriving for the day. Child-to-staff ratios were within regulation according to the Early Childhood Services Act.

Licensing staff noted that a purposefully planned activity schedule was posted on the wall when observing in the mixed two/three/four classroom.

Licensing staff noted only positive child guidance during the follow-up inspection visit.

Licensing staff was conducting the follow-up inspection and noted that the administrator did not have access to the monthly review and maintenance plan checklist for the stationary equipment located on the outdoor play space. Please ensure that when the director of the licensed facility is not present at the licensed facility, the administrator has access to all files regarding renewal inspection or monitoring visits conducted by licensing staff.

While licensing staff was conducting the licensing renewal inspection visit, it was noted that the gate, that divides the two play grounds, could still be unlatched when pushed with little force and open up. Licensing staff noted that a hole was dug into the pavement to try and secure the gate however, licensing staff could easily push the gate open. Therefore the gate was not secure enough to keep the children from going from one playground to the other. Please ensure the gate, when latched, stays latched to ensure the safety of the children.
