General Comments

Annual inspection performed.

After children ate snack one group was observed decorating gingerbread houses, then licensing staff observed all children getting dressed for outside play. Educators assisted children that needed help with toileting and getting dressed for outdoor play. Children were observed washing hands after coming indoors and at other prescribed times. They are familiar with the routine.

Outside children were observed sliding on crazy carpets or saucers on the small hill in the outdoor play space. They were observed laughing and squealing while sliding. Some educators were observed pulling the children up the hill on the sled and then supervised them as they slide down the hill. Other staff were observed assisting children with climbing up the ladder and sliding down the small slide. Staff intervened if children had disagreements by encouraging a child to tell their friend they were sorry for pushing them. Staff were observed engaged with children and interacting with them outside and participating in play, and this shows children their teacher values what they do.

Appropriate child guidance was observed, and staff were seen kneeling down at children's eye level to get their attention. They were also heard saying "good job, very nice, no thank you, and asking children it they needed help with opening lunch dishes". Children are provided explanations in language that is easily understood. All children were observed eating lunch and chatting with their friends and washing hands before going down for a nap. 13 children were observed napping and the 3 preschoolers that do not nap were observed in quiet play activities. All children were observed waking up from nap and washing hands and toileting.

Appropriate Public Health practices were followed, and staff were observed cleaning and sanitizing tables and removing mouthed toys from circulation.

Children have varied interests at this time - the babies are exploring different sounds, pushing trucks, looking at books and learning to climb and walk more steadily. Another group is interested in trucks, play doe and they are fascinated with the Little fish and Sleeping Bears songs and have worked on a project. Other children are interested in dinosaurs, play doh, and paw patrol. The school age group dropped off their backpacks and headed to the park.
