General Comments

On the day of the monitoring inspection visit, when licensing staff arrived at the facility, the children were lining up inside the classroom to go to the washroom to wash up for morning snack.

While licensing staff was conducting the monitoring inspection visit, the classroom had their first fire drill of the year. The fire bell was very loud but the children were not afraid as the educators relayed to the children beforehand that the bell will make a loud noise when it goes off. All children followed the directions given by the educators. Well done!

It was awesome that the educators recognized that when the children became satiated with an activity the educators switched the activity to a "get-up-and-move" activity. The educators put on some music and the children stood in a circle and passed a bean bag around to their peers.

Licensing staff observed the children participate primarily in an educator led program on the day of the inspection visit. Licensing staff recommends the educators introduce more choice as well as more activities based on the children's interests in the future as to align more with the New Brunswick Framework Curriculum for Early Learning and Child Care- English.

While conducting a monitoring inspection visit, licensing staff noted Lysol disinfectant spray and wipes stored out of sight and up out of reach of children; however, all toxic materials such as Lysol disinfectant products are required to be stored in a cabinet or closet that is secured by a lock and key. When this was brought to the attention of the educators, the educators moved the disinfectant products to an area that that is secured by a lock and key to ensure the safety of the children.
