- Visit to the learning center for an unexpected monitoring inspection
- Ratio was respected during the visit
- A space is dedicated for each child's personal belongings, they are easily accessible and labeled with the name of the child, that space is only used for the intended child and is stored separately.
- Pacifiers or soothers do not have neck strings
- Posted in a visible and prominent place in the facility is; The license, inspection report, daily routine, evacuation procedures, the name of the operator/administrator, name and telephone number of QA monitor and inspectors, any life-threatening allergies and a notice to inform parents of the existence of a communicable disease
- Administrator and educators must hold a valid first aid certificate and a valid CPR certificate
- The administrator and at least 50% of educators holds a one-year Early Childhood Education Certificate or training that is equivalent
- An inclusive environment is provided for all children
- Daily activities include Purposely planned and documented program, time and space for a free choice of play experiences, indoor and outdoor opportunities for physical activity and individual and group experiences. Opportunities for various forms of literacy and to express creativity and interests. Opportunities to explore the arts and sciences and to experience accomplishment and success, to problem solve and to develop trusting, respectful and supportive relationships.
- The children's guidance is done in a respectful and positive way
- Indoor play area is maintained safe and clean
- Indoor play area materials and equipment varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present is easily accessible on low open shelves, clean and in good repair.
- Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies are locked and inaccessible to children
- In all rooms, evidence of purposeful planning based on children's interest and learning, webbing, invitation, photos and learning stories were posted.
- Educators observed engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations.
